Academic Integrity

- Concerns were raised by parents and students about issues surrounding academic integrity
- Naples MHS is developing a school wide policy to address this issue with established consequences for cheating, plagiarism, etc.
- The new policy will be emailed to all registered parents after it is adopted by the faculty as well as added to the student/parent handbook

Attendance/Tardy



- DoDEA believes that students should be in school to take advantage of classroom instruction and learning opportunities
- We understand there are times when student must be absent
- Please communicate a student absence to the attendance clerk by telephone or email
- Students who have 7 or more unexcused absences may be referred to the Student Support Team
- Excessive unexcused absences could result in the school administration reaching out to command for assistance
- Try and plan family trips around scheduled times out of school, family trips will be recorded as unexcused absences
- For absences longer than 2 school days, please obtain a pre-arranged absence form from the front office and please have it returned at least a week prior to departure (when possible)
- Encourage your kids to be in class on time, 3 tardies in a three week period will earn a two hour detention after school

Attendance Cont.

- Excused absences can include:
 - Personal illness
 - Medical, dental, or mental health appointment
 - Serious illness in the student's immediate family
 - A death in the student's immediate family or of a relative
 - Religious holiday
 - Emergency conditions such as fire, flood, or storm
 - Unique family circumstances warranting absence and coordinated with school administration.
 - College visits that cannot be scheduled on non-school days
 - Reasonable amounts of time surrounding deployments and reintegration providing missed schoolwork is obtained in advance and completed upon return.

Dress Standards

- A new, more comprehensive set of dress standards are being developed and will be released to parents via email once they have been adopted by the faculty
- Students not compliant with the dress standards face a progressive set of consequences

General Guidelines

- Clothing items may not be see-through or laced.
- Leggings/jeggings/spandex type items without shorts, tunics, a dress, or a skirt are prohibited. Tight fitting garments are not to be worn. Fingertip rule applies.
- Cleavage and midriffs may not show.
- Strapless tops and spaghetti straps are not acceptable at Naples Middle High School.

Dress Standards Cont.

TOPS:

- Students may wear long or short-sleeved shirts, jackets, sweaters, and sweatshirts. Vests may be worn over shirts.
- Shirts must extend below the natural waistline or be tucked in.
- Undershirts, ribbed undershirts (for males and females) may be worn only as undergarments and may not show below outer tops. Undergarments may not be visible.

SLACKS, SHORTS, CAPRIS, SKIRTS, AND SKORTS:

- All must be secured at the natural waistline, belts are to be worn, no sagging. Jeans with holes/slits are not allowed.
- Shorts, skirts, skorts must meet the finger tip test or measure not more than 3 inches from the knee (including the slit).
- All must be plain or pleated style (cargo pants and jeans accepted if they meet other requirements).
- Pajama pants or other sleepwear may not be worn. Sweats/Training type suits/Presentation suits/athletic style shorts are not permitted.

Dress Standards Cont.

SHOES:

- Students are expected to wear shoes with supportive soles and sides and closed toes for lab classes.
- Shoes manufactured with buckles, Velcro clasps or shoestrings will be buckled, attached, clasped or tied securely on both feet at all times. Sandals/slides may be worn.
- Bedroom slippers are not permitted.

SPIRIT DAY, DRESS DAY:

- Coaches frequently request team members to dress up the day of a game or the day of a departure for a game. When team uniforms are worn an undershirt is to be worn with 'singlet' type tops, ie cross country, basketball, softball, track, and other uniforms. Team shorts are not appropriate wear to school. Cheer uniforms are appropriate on stipulated days.

Dress Standards Cont.

ACCESSORIES:

- Shirts with school related monograms and logos are permitted. All other logos must be appropriate to the educational atmosphere (without gang affiliation or sexual innuendos and promoting no drug culture, alcohol, or nicotine based products).
- Small moderate and safe jewelry is acceptable excluding chains, spikes, or gothic jewelry.
- Natural style makeup only – no club or costume makeup.
- Good manners require that hats and head coverings be removed upon entering any building and remain off while in any building. Bandanas are not allowed.
- Hair bands (not sweat bands) serving the purpose of holding hair in place are appropriate.
- Hair must be well groomed and styled to allow the wearer's face/eyes to be visible. The hairstyle of any individual may not interfere with the vision, safety and health of any other individual or the educational process.
- No spike type piercings allowed to be worn

Dress Standards Cont.

DRESS STANDARD VIOLATIONS

- First Offense: Warning – change clothing
- Second Offense – Detention – 1 day – change clothing
- Third Offense – Detention – 1 day – change clothing – meeting between student, parent, administrator
- Fourth Offense – 2 Detentions – change clothing – further action as needed between student, parent, administrator

Electronics Use Policy

- Students may not use electronic devices such as iPods, MP3 players, or any other device that uses head phones or ear buds while in the hallways before school, during class changes and breaks, or after school while in the building. Students must discontinue use before entering the building
- Electronic devices may be utilized during a student's assigned lunch period in the cafeteria and courtyard
- Teachers may set use policies for their individual classroom
- Cell phone use is not allowed during school hours, this includes phone calls or texting
- We strongly advise students not bring expensive electronic devices to school. Naples MHS cannot be responsible for lost or stolen devices
